Membership Requirements:

1. No membership is required for submission for school class projects up to grade eight.
2. A Junior membership is required to enter items from home.

CHILDREN'S ENTRY RULES:

1. All work must be done by the exhibitor. Parents are urged to encourage their children in every way, but allow them to do the work themselves.
2. All entries must be the work of the individual and at the appropriate school level.
3. All baking to be on paper plates, and sealed within a plastic baggie.
4. Grades refer to school grades as of June, but students beginning pre-school in September may also exhibit.
5. Only one entry per person, per class.
6. Regulation entry tags must be attached, written in blue or black ink, with the child's name. For school entries, the name of the school must be written on the entry tag.
7. A child may enter an item in a more senior age category.

Entry forms are available at the Massey Fair Office, Massey Public Library, the fair website and facebook.

TEACHERS PLEASE NOTE:

We can take only 3 entries in each section from each class if items are being sent from school.
Children may bring items from home to the Winnifred Mooney Hall on:

Wednesday from 4-8 pm
And
Thursday from 9-12 noon

NO EXHIBITS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 12 NOON ON THURSDAY

All exhibits should be removed on Sunday after 4:00 pm.

Prizes will be paid by cheque and will be mailed within three (3) weeks of the last day of the fair.

Flavour, Taste and Aroma
Colour and Design
Creativity and Workmanship

CLASS #101 – AGES 5 YEARS AND UNDER

Section:

2. A play dough or plasticine model of a person or animal
3. A decorated party hat
4. Other

CLASS #102 – AGES 6 TO 10

Section:

5. Sand art in a bottle or jar
6. Fridge magnet using felt, buttons, etc.
7. A poster paint, crayon or marker picture
8. A tea party hat
9. A home- made birthday card
10. Candy creature made from candy, marshmallows, etc.
11. A wildflower arrangement in a toy

12. Model of a person, animal or creature from any modeling medium
13. A mobile or wind chimes
14. Water colour, pencil or crayon painting
15. Thumb print picture
16. Any item (creature, vehicle etc.) made from Lego etc.
17. Flower arrangement made in a toy

CLASS #103 – AGES 6 TO 10 - Baking

All baking must be made from scratch except where it is judged for decoration only. RECIPE MUST BE ATTACHED.

Exhibit must be on a white paper plate, inside a Ziploc bag.

Section:

18. Decorated cookie made in an 8" or 9" pie plate
19. Three cookie cutter cookies
20. Three tea biscuits
21. Three chocolate chip cookies
22. Three pieces of candy, one variety

CLASS #104 – AGES 11 TO 17

Section:

23. Mask original design – any medium
24. Dream catcher
25. Picture – pencil, charcoal or pastel
26. Painting – watercolour, oil or acrylic
27. Woodwork item
28. Model creation from Lego – maximum to 2' square
29. Flower arrangement in a tea cup or mug

CLASS #105 – AGES 11 TO 17 - BAKING

All baking must be made from scratch except where it is judged for decoration only. RECIPE MUST BE ATTACHED.
Exhibit must be on a white paper plate, inside a Ziploc Bag.

Section:

30. Cake judged for decoration only
31. Three pieces of brownies without icing
32. Pie made in 5" pie plate
33. Three peanut butter cookies

CLASS #106 – JUNIOR PHOTOGRAPHY – ALL AGES

All pictures are to be mounted securely and ready to hang.
No photograph may be older than three years.

Section:

34. Colour action shot – any subject
35. Colour portrait – small group
36. Colour landscape
37. Colour portrait – head and shoulders
38. Colour pets or animal

CLASS #107 – FIELD CROPS, ROOTS & VEGETABLES - AGES 5 TO 17

The junior MUST HAVE HELPED in planting, growing, harvesting and preparing the exhibit. Exhibits must be displayed on a white paper plate.

Section:

39. Barley or oats – 1 quart
40. Corn – 3 stalks
41. Oats, barley or wheat – 1 sheaf
42. Sunflower – largest head
43. Pumpkin – largest by weight
44. Three each – potatoes, carrots & beets
45. Three each – onions, tomatoes (ripe), & peas
46. Most unusual shaped vegetable
47. Vegetable critter made with tooth picks and wheels if desired

CLASS #108 – SEWING – AGES 11 TO 17

Section:

48. Lap quilt
49. Any other style or size of quilt
50. Quilt made from a kit
51. Placemats
52. Table runner
53. Any other sewing item

CLASS # 109 – KNITTING & CROCHETING – AGES 11 TO 17

Section:

54. Any knit or crocheted item
